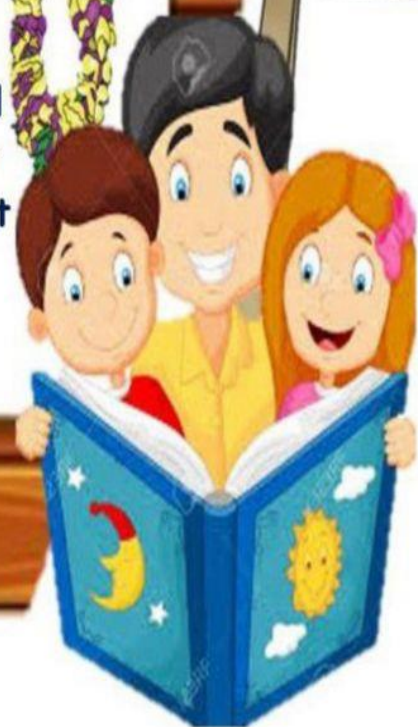
Summer Holiday
